






In 2022 we witnessed a decline in children with the PIT Count. Unfortunately, in 2023, the numbers increased to be on level with the increases since 2018.

Increases: Unsheltered, Over 60, Veterans, School-Aged Children;

Decreases: Racial disparities continue in services and housing in our region, however, this is the first year POC experiencing homelessness decreased in the region; Children under 5 years of age.
